ORDINANCE 0.2058-2019

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A SPECIAL EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$975,000.00 TO FUND ACCRUED SICK AND VACATION TIME EXPENSES ARISING FROM THE RETIREMENT OF SEVERAL EMPLOYEES IN AND BY THE TOWNSHIP OF EDISON, IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, NEW JERSEY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF EDISON, IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, NEW JERSEY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Accrued sick and vacation time expenses arising from the retirement of several employees, including all legal expenses and related costs, in and by the Township of Edison is hereby authorized, and a special emergency appropriation of \$975,000.00 is hereby authorized pursuant to the Local Budget Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-53).

Section 2. A copy of this ordinance as finally adopted shall be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect in accordance with applicable law.

ORDINANCE 0.2059-2019

EXPLANATION: An Ordinance adopting the "1696 Oak Tree Road Redevelopment Plan," for the property identified on the Township Tax Maps as Block 546-I, Lot 37 (also known as 1696 Oak Tree Road), pursuant to the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-1 et seq.

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-1 *et seq.* (the "Act"), authorizes municipalities to determine whether certain parcels of land in the municipality constitute areas in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, to determine whether certain parcels of land constitute areas in need of redevelopment under the Redevelopment Law, the municipal council ("**Municipal Council**") of the Township of Edison (the "**Township**") must authorize the planning board of the Township (the "**Planning Board**") to conduct a preliminary investigation of the area and make recommendations to the Municipal Council; and

WHEREAS, on March 27, 2019, the Municipal Council adopted a resolution authorizing and directing the Planning Board to conduct an investigation of the property commonly known on the Township tax maps as Block 540-I, Lot 37 (hereinafter the "**Study Area**"), to determine whether the Study Area meets the criteria set forth in the Redevelopment Law, specifically *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-5, and should be designated as an area in need of redevelopment, which designation would authorize the Township and Municipal Council to use all those powers permitted by the Redevelopment Law, other than the power of eminent domain; and

WHEREAS, on June 17, 2019, the Planning Board, after providing due notice, conducted a public hearing in accordance with the Redevelopment Law and determined that the Study Area qualified as an area in need of redevelopment and recommended that the Municipal Council designate the Study Area as an area in need of redevelopment pursuant to the criteria and requirements of the Redevelopment Law; and

WHEREAS, on June 26, 2019, the Municipal Council accepted the recommendation of the Planning Board and adopted a resolution which designated the Study Area as an "area in need of redevelopment" ("**Redevelopment Area**") in accordance with the Redevelopment Law; and

WHEREAS, on November 13, 2019, the Municipal Council resolved to authorize and direct the Planning Board to review a redevelopment plan for the Redevelopment Area entitled "1696 Oak Tree Road Redevelopment Plan" (the "**Redevelopment Plan**") and to make recommendations as required by *N.J.S.A.*40A:12A-7(e);

- **WHEREAS**, on April 15, 2019, the Planning Board reviewed the Redevelopment Plan and made comments to the Municipal Council concerning the Redevelopment Plan and recommending the adoption of same; and
- **WHEREAS**, upon review of the Planning Board's recommendation of the Redevelopment Plan, the Municipal Council has determined to adopt the Redevelopment Plan (in the form attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u>), to ensure the success of redevelopment within the Redevelopment Area in conformity with the Township's redevelopment objectives.
- **NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Municipal Council of the Township of Edison, County of Middlesex, New Jersey that:
- Section 1. The aforementioned recitals are incorporated herein as though fully set forth at length.
- Section 2. The Redevelopment Plan, attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u>, is hereby adopted pursuant to the terms of *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-7.
- Section 3. A copy of this Ordinance and the Redevelopment Plan shall be available for public inspection at the office of the Township Clerk during regular business hours.
 - Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect in accordance with all applicable laws.

ORDINANCE 0.2060-2019

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS IN AND BY THE TOWNSHIP OF EDISON, IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$15,000,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$14,250,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF EDISON, IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The several improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby respectively authorized to be undertaken by the Township of Edison, in the County of Middlesex, New Jersey (the "Township") as general improvements. For the several improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there are hereby appropriated the respective sums of money therein stated as the appropriation made for each improvement or purpose, such sums amounting in the aggregate to \$15,000,000, and further including the aggregate sum of \$750,000 as the several down payments for the improvements or purposes required by the Local Bond Law. The down payments have been made available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in one or more previously adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the several improvements or purposes not covered by application of the several down payments, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to

be issued in the principal amount of \$14,250,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. The several improvements hereby authorized and the several purposes for which the bonds are to be issued, the estimated cost of each improvement and the appropriation therefor, the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for each improvement and the period of usefulness of each improvement are as follows:

The excess of the appropriation made for each of the improvements or purposes aforesaid over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor, as above stated, is the amount of the down payment for each purpose.

All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as Section 4. may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no bond anticipation note shall mature later than one year from its date, unless such bond anticipation notes are permitted to mature at such later date in accordance with applicable law. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer of the Township is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the Township and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the Township. The chief financial officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Township pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the Township and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof,

provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Township fails to comply with its undertaking, the Township shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

Section 10. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Township for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.
